All About the Books

Book sales are the main source of income. Our major book sale is held annually in the Winter with mini sales in June and December at the Bristol Public Library and F.N. Manross Memorial Library. Visit the library's website and booksalefinder.com for information about these events.

The Friends maintains a Book Store for the sale of used books and audio-visual materials at bargain prices. The Book Store is located on the lower level of the Bristol Public Library and is open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Friends' volunteers staff the Book Store.

Books for sale are also located at the Bristol Public Library across from the elevator on the first floor (a limited number of free books are available too) and in the corner near the large print room, as well as the Friends' Café on the second floor.
